## School Goal #1: Endorse sound pedagogy with all teachers

### Year One – 2018/19

- Veteran teachers assigned as grade level to mentor new teaching staff.
- Use of Professional Learning Communities to support dialogue and embrace a collective vision among Division I and Division II teachers.
- Curriculum Mapping with school lead teacher and BGRS learning consultants.

### Year Two – 2019/20

- Review Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) results to identify areas of growth and to celebrate successes.
- Continue tracking progress of Division I and Division II students to target instructional needs
- Implementation of standardized assessment tools for all grades.

### Year Three – 2020/21

- Provide collaborative Professional Development (PD) opportunities to develop common language and collective goals.
- Continue yearly data analysis of PATs, Accountability Pillar Surveys and school assessment data.

## School Goal #2: Promote Daily 5, STAR & AR Language Arts programs to promote systematic student growth in reading.

### Year One – 2018/19

- All teachers to use Daily 5 in conjunction with Accelerated Reader (AR) and Standardized Test for the Assessment of Reading (STAR).
- Grade level and Division meetings to facilitate and embrace use of AR and STAR to support Daily 5
- Fund the AR and STAR program for three-year implementation.

### Year Two – 2019/20

- Record student progress by daily tracking and monitoring of student reading.
- Public recognition for student reading accomplishments in school assemblies.
- Survey staff to determine teacher satisfaction with program and determine long-term sustainability and feasibility of program.

### Year Three – 2020/21

- Fund program for an additional year if student enthusiasm and participation in the program continues to flourish and staff support remains high.
- Continue collective PLC dialogue to promote continued use of Daily 5, STAR and AR language learning tools.
