Grade 4,5 & 6 CTF: UPDATE / EXCITING NEWS

Career and Technology Foundations (CTF) provides students in grades 4-6 the opportunity to explore their interests within various areas and technologies. CTF started this week on Wednesday, Oct 23rd. Here is a brief description of each CTF option. All grade 4-6 students will rotate through each option, switching every 5 weeks.

- <u>Strategy Games (Mrs. Hodge)</u>: Hands-on strategy games are engaging activities that promote critical thinking, teamwork, and strategic planning. These games often require players to make quick decisions based on limited information, use various problem-solving techniques, and have students apply mathematical techniques/ tools. Integrating strategy games into CTF offers a dynamic way to enhance learning experiences. These games foster essential skills in a fun, competitive environment while connecting students to various curricular goals and peers.
- <u>Minecraft Coding (Mr. Walker)</u>: In Mr. Walker's CTF option class, students will dive into the world of coding using Minecraft Education. Along the way, students will also develop essential computer skills, including problem-solving, logical thinking, and digital collaboration. This hands-on approach will help students understand the applications of coding while engaging their creativity and critical thinking.
- <u>Arts & Crafts (Mrs. Dublanko)</u>: In this CTF course, students will explore a variety of arts and crafts techniques, enhancing both creativity and problem-solving skills. They will engage in hands-on projects that allow them to experiment with different materials such as paper, fabric, clay, and recyclable items. This course will encourage students to develop craftsmanship and attention to detail while working on individual and group projects.





• <u>Competitive Gaming (Mr. Lewis)</u>: Competitive Gaming is an engaging experience with computer games that promote fair play, teamwork, and good sportsmanship. It also emphasizes developing strategies for self-calming and relaxation, ensuring a balanced and positive approach to healthy competition.
